The calculation methodology changes are:

- a. An offender released to a detainer, deceased, or transferred to another jurisdiction is not included. (Result: A lower number of releases.)
- An offender released multiple times during a calendar year is counted only once for his/her first release that calendar year. (Result: A lower number of releases.)



- c. An offender is tracked for a period of sixty months following his/her release from incarceration. Currently an offender is tracked for a full five calendar years following the year of release. (Result: A lower number of returns.)
