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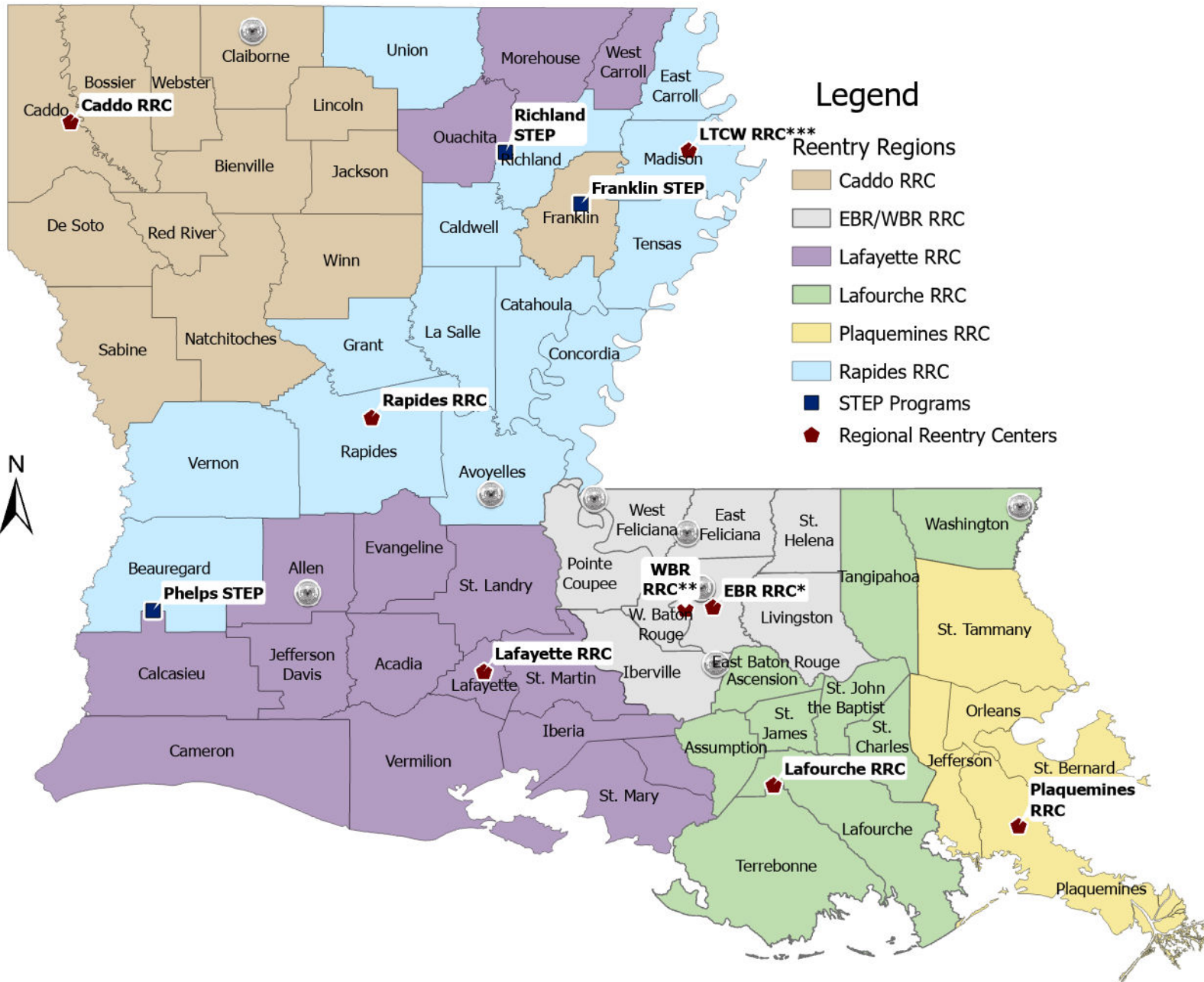

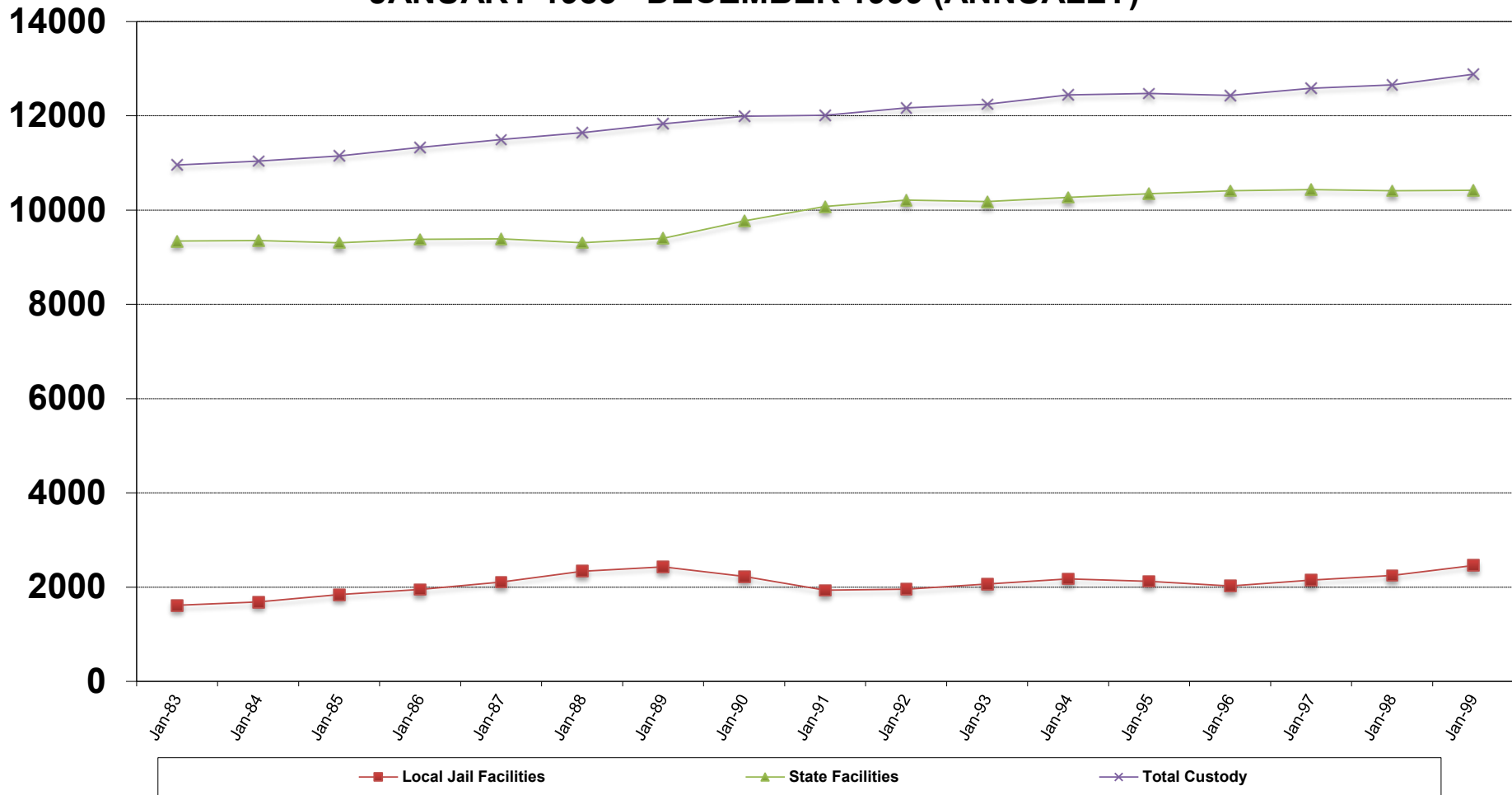

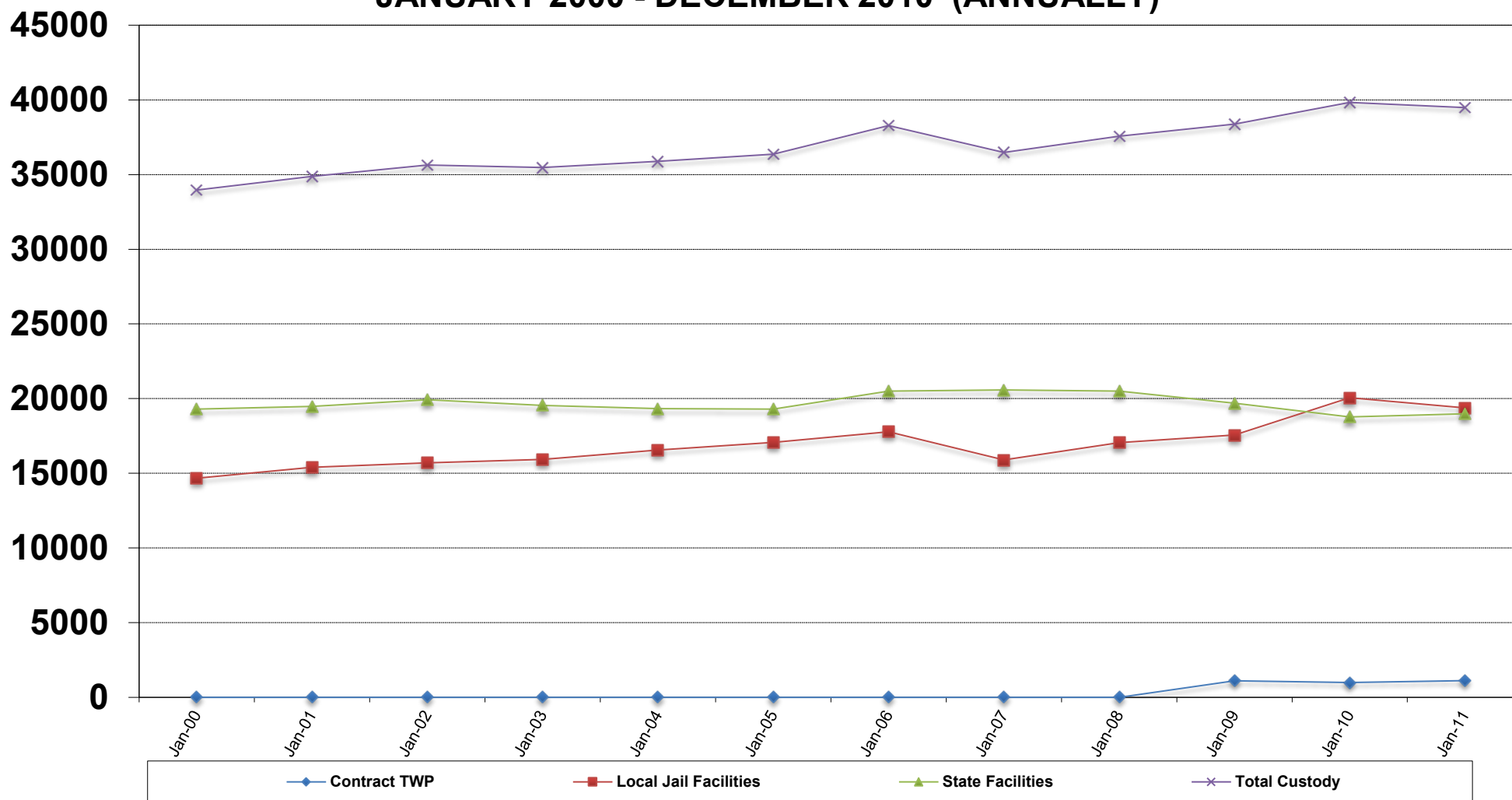

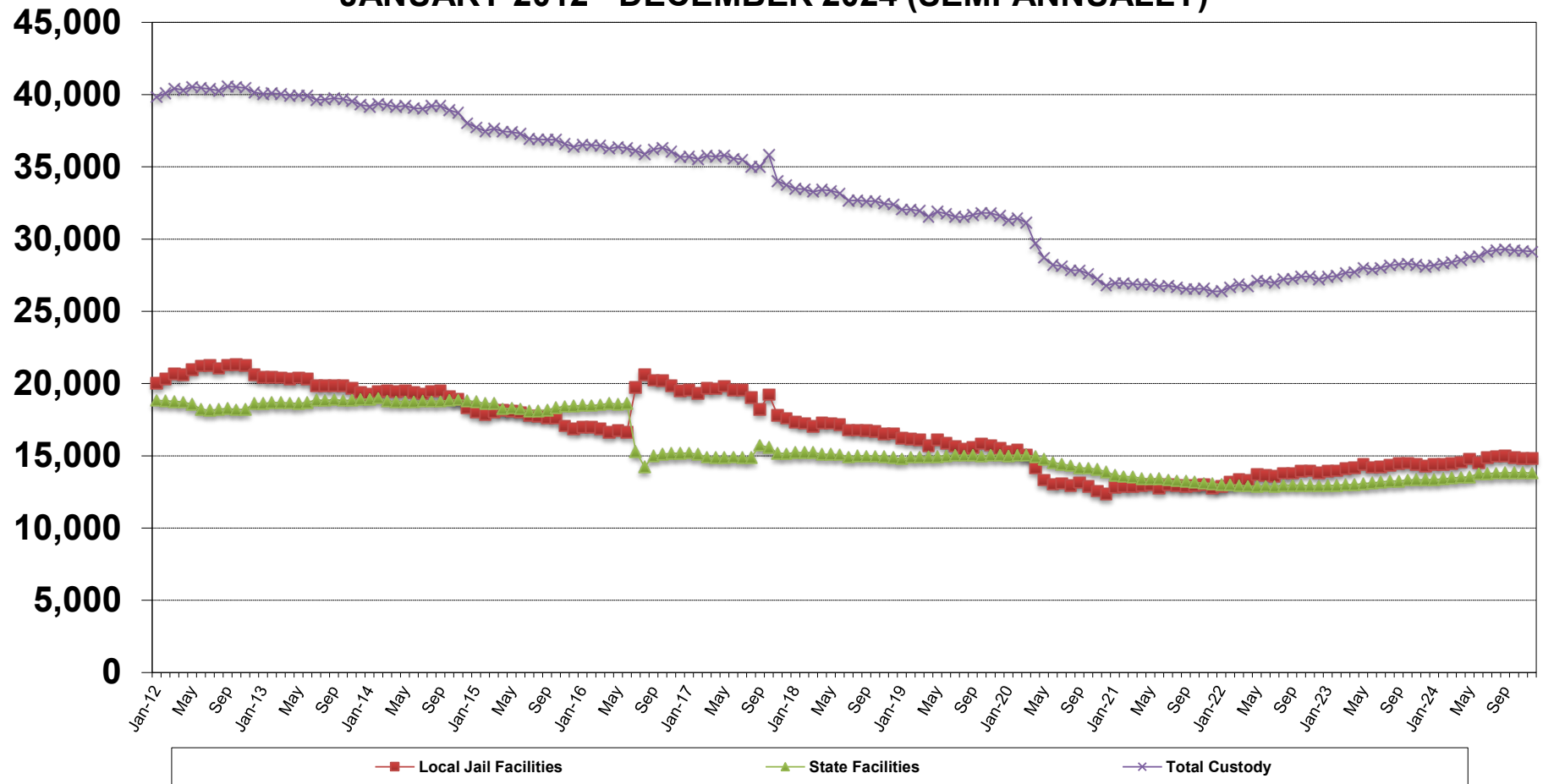

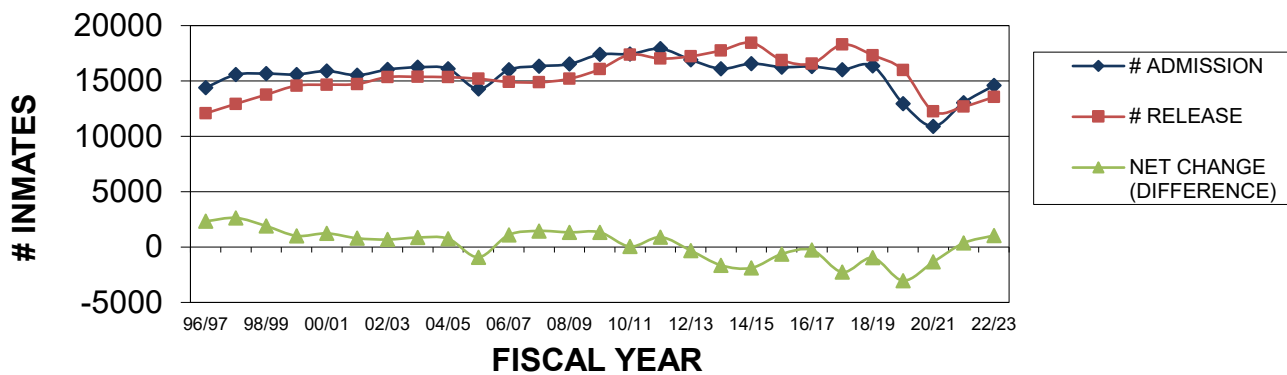

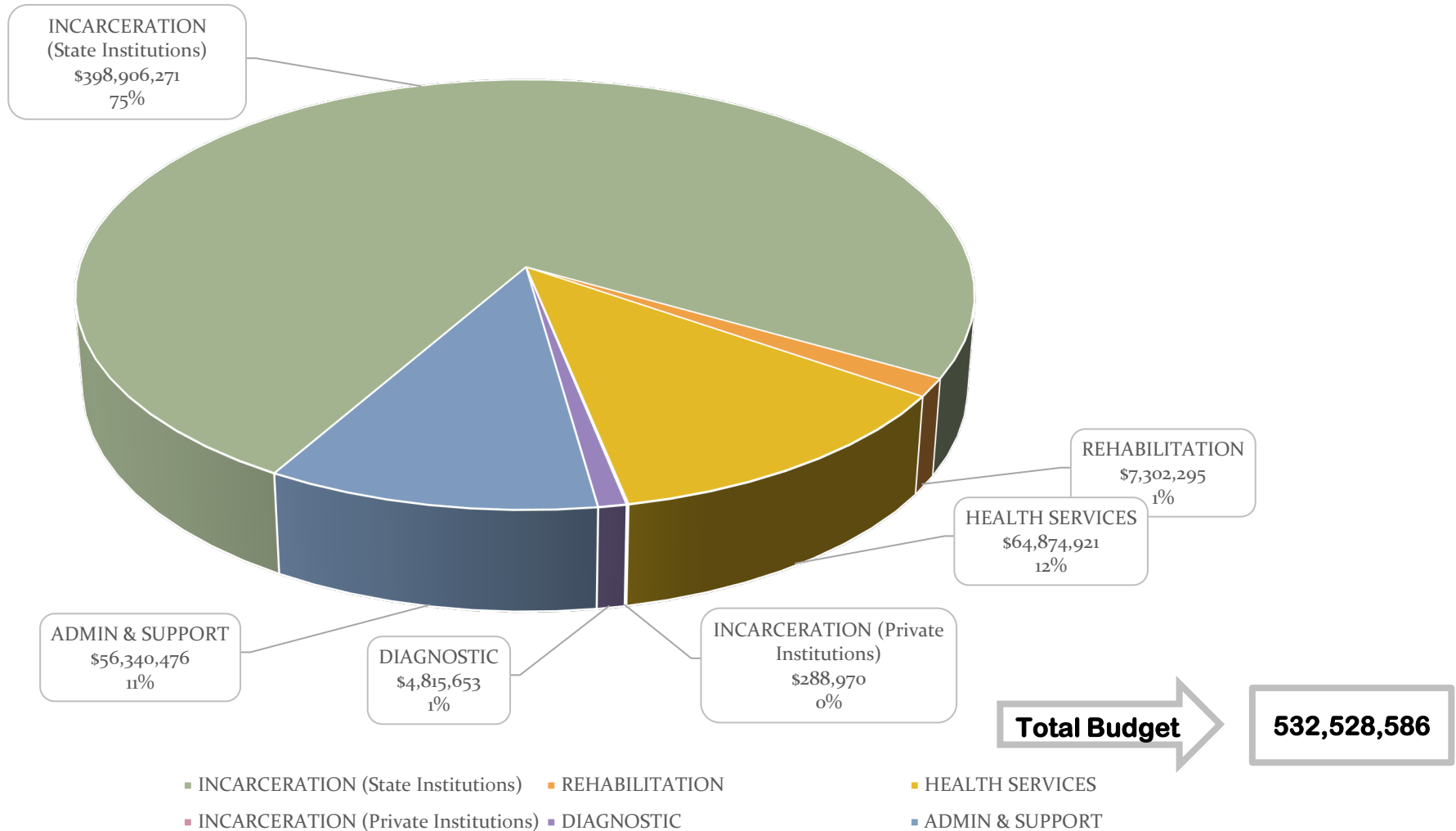
DPS&C - CORRECTIONS SERVICES

FY 2024-2025 Per Act 4



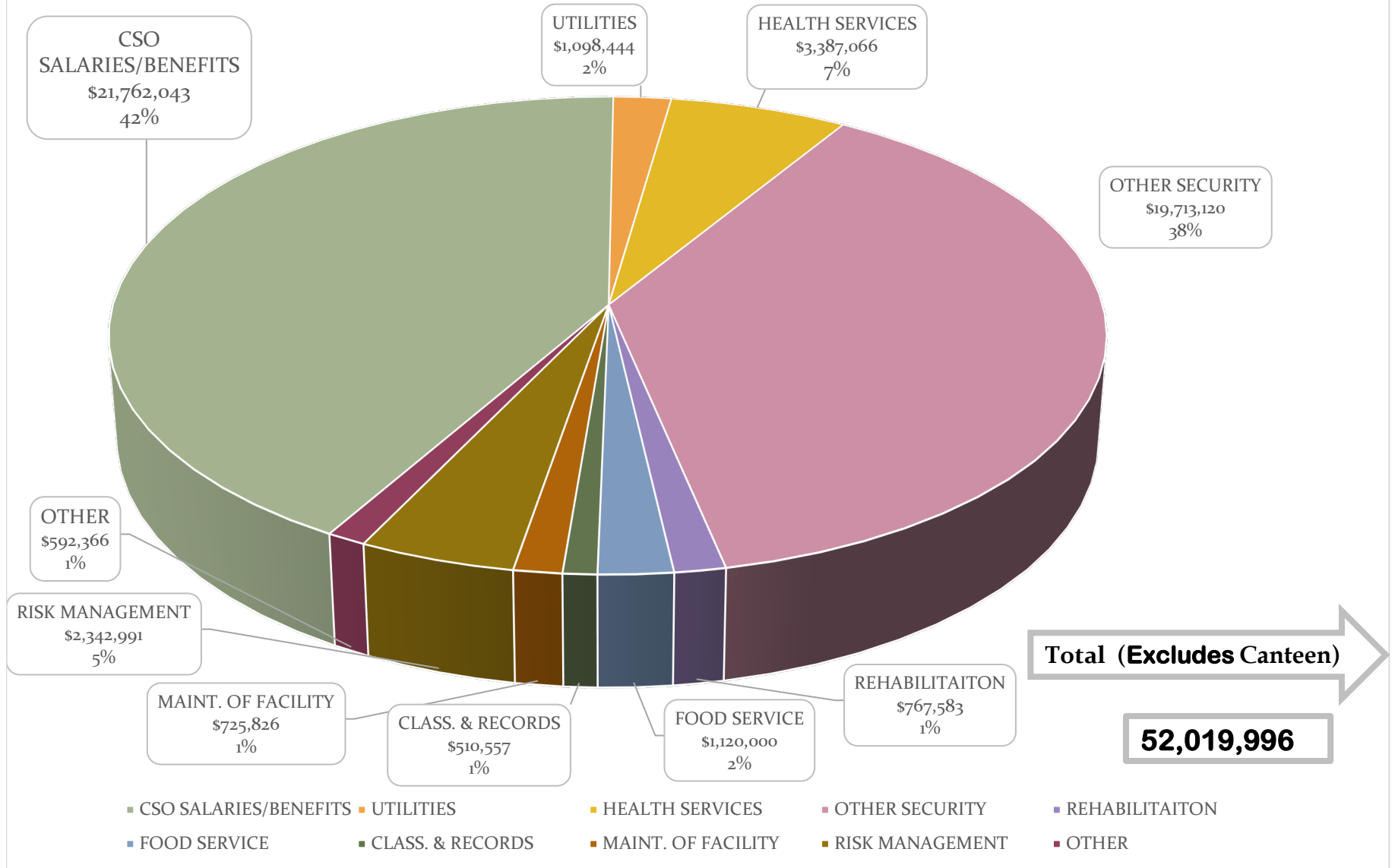

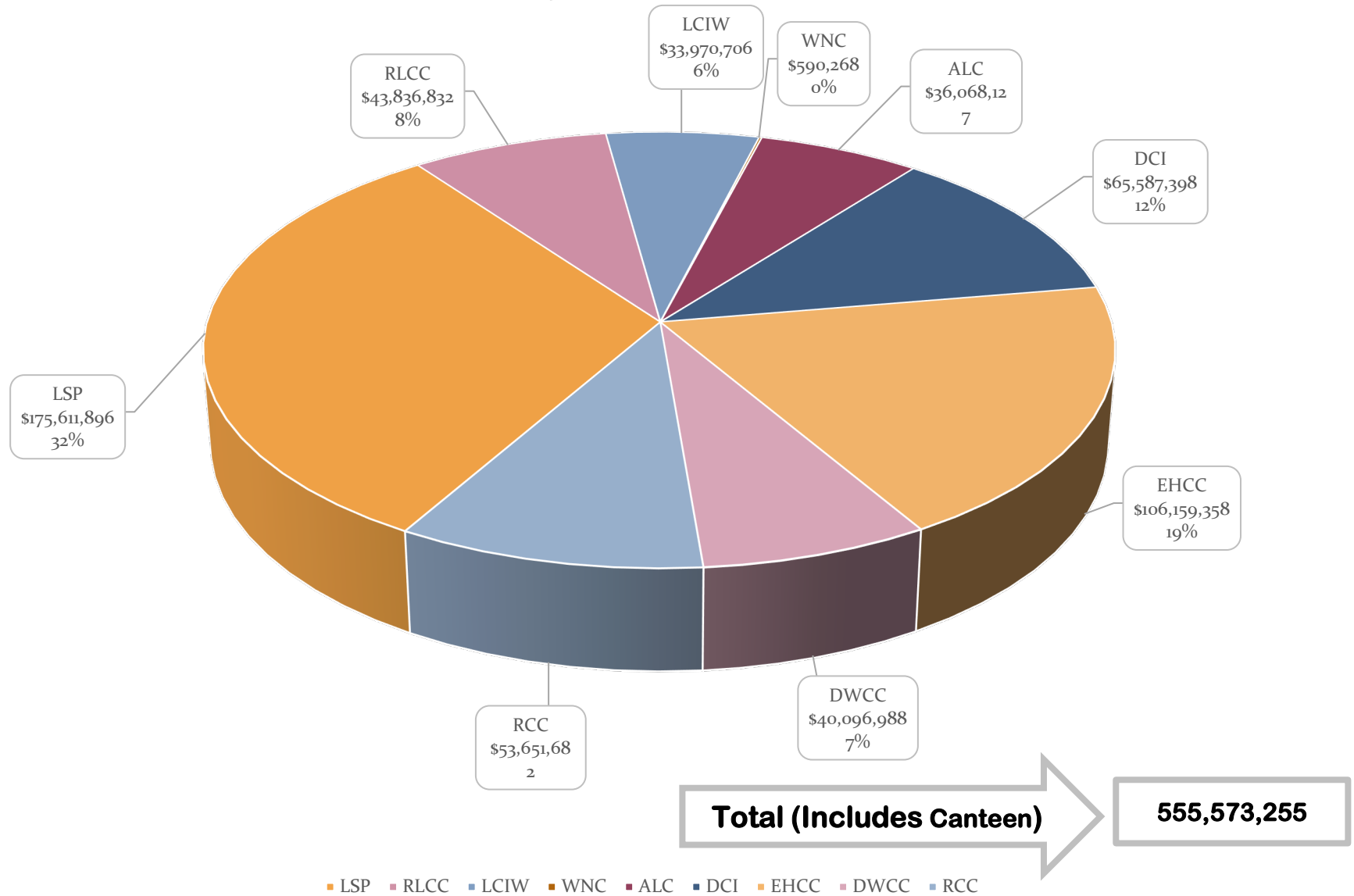
DPS&C - CORRECTIONS SERVICES

FY 2024-2025 Per Act 4



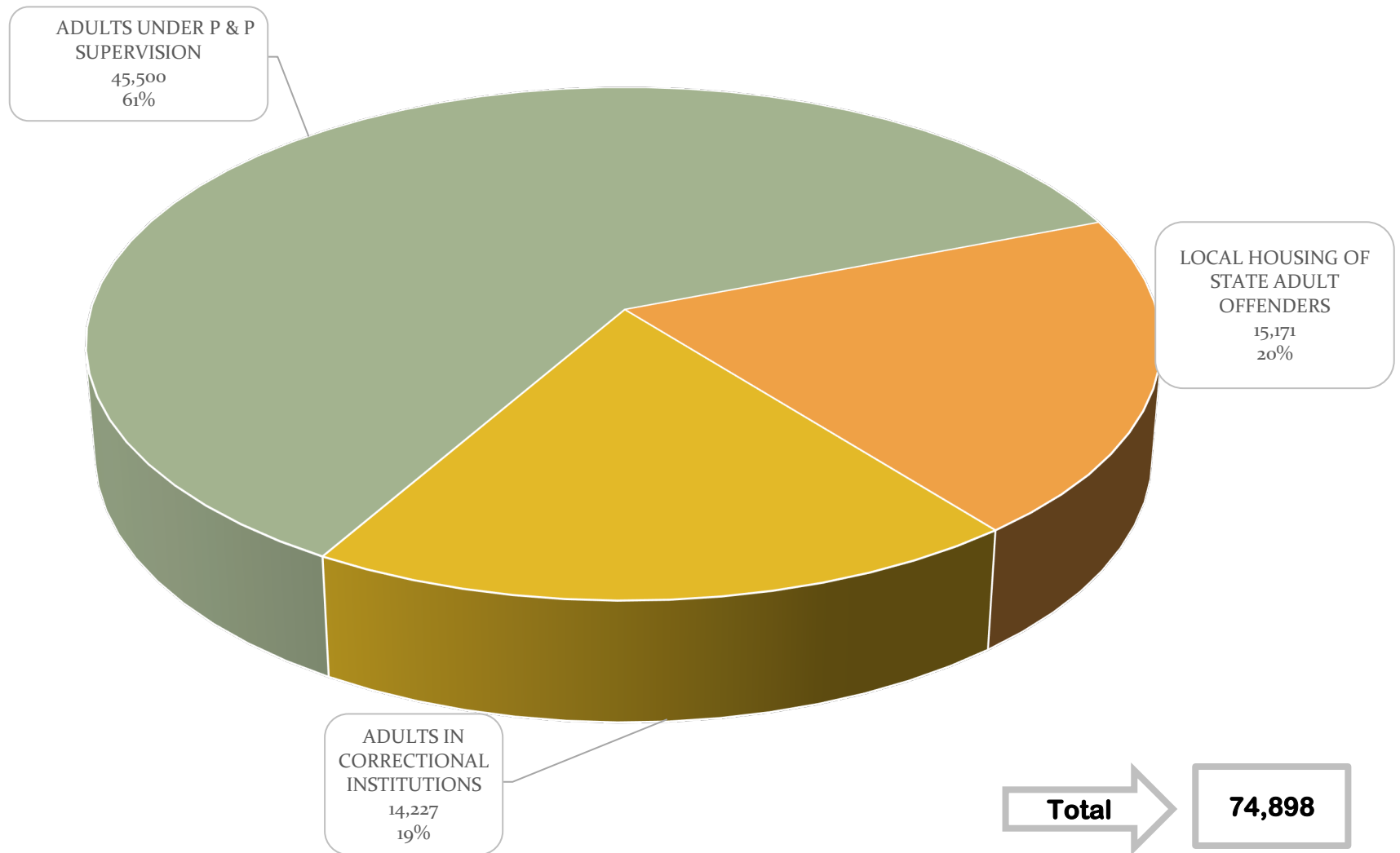

FY 2024-2025 Per Act 4

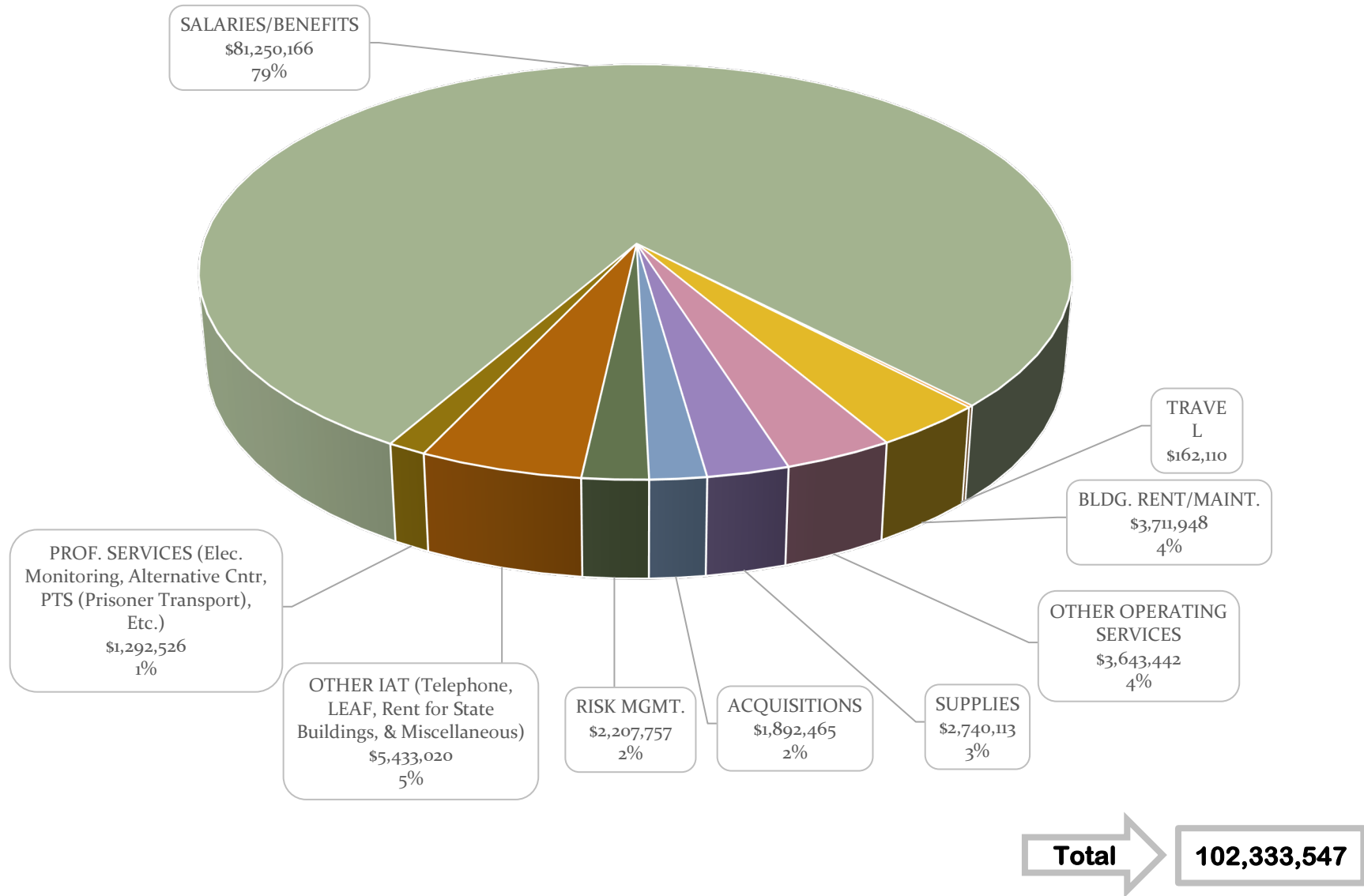

Region 1 - By Average Population



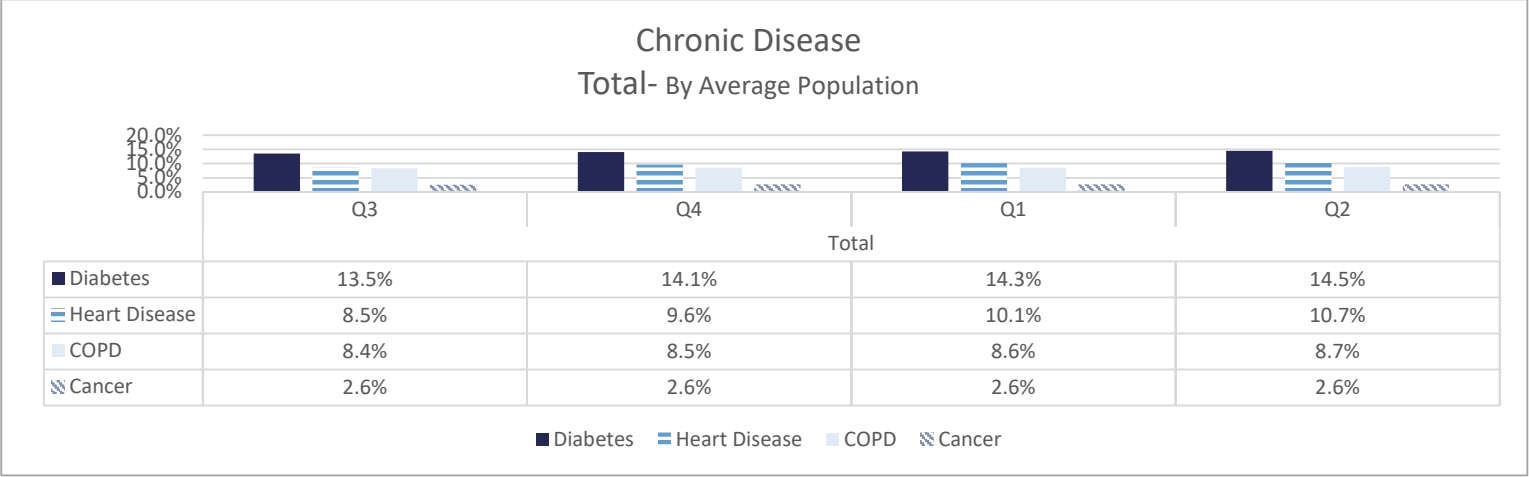
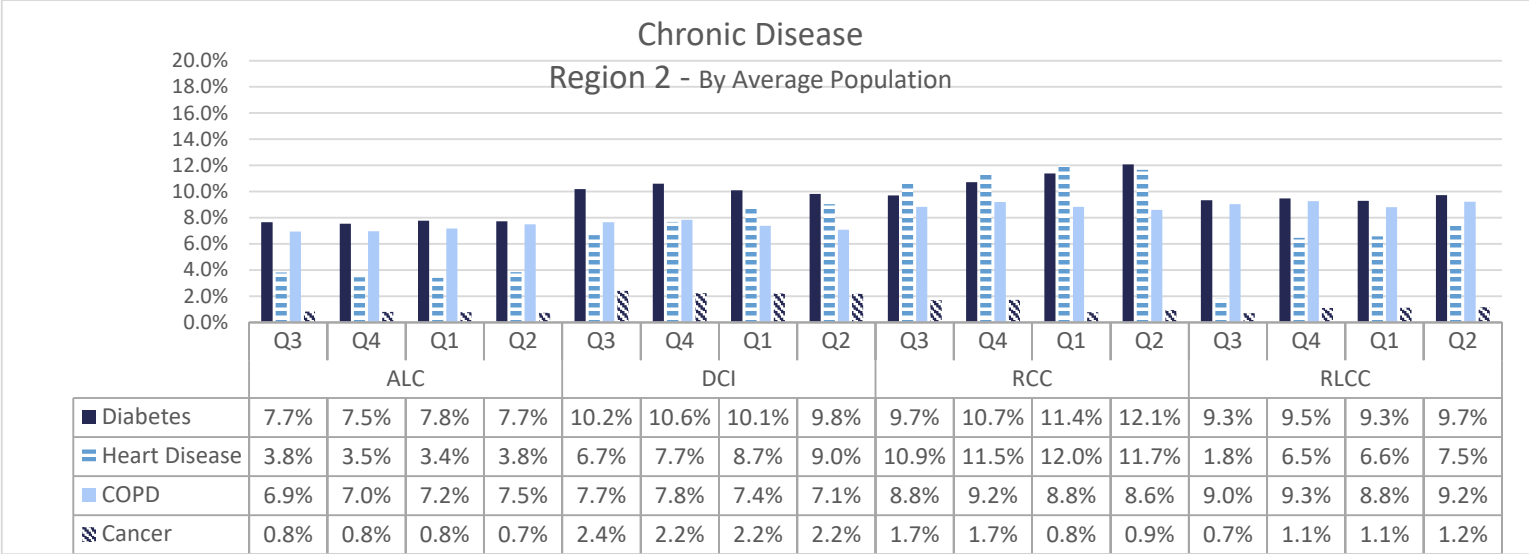
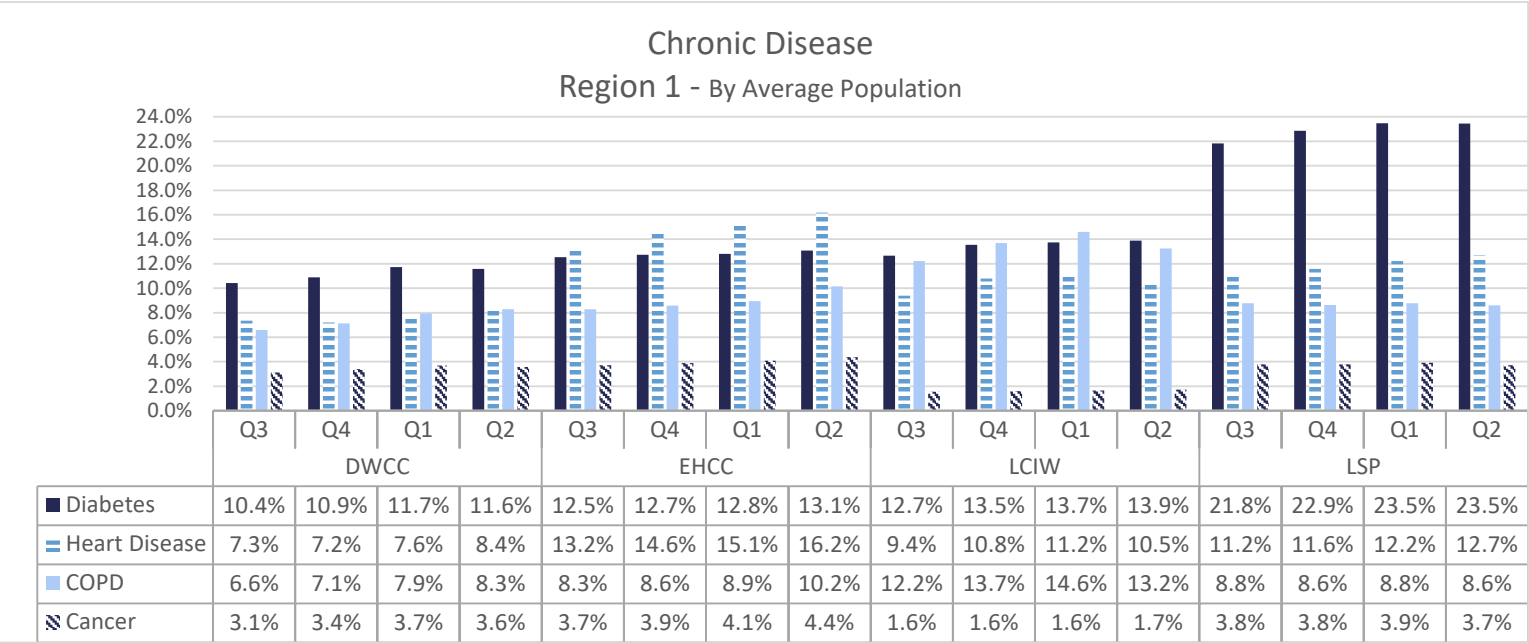

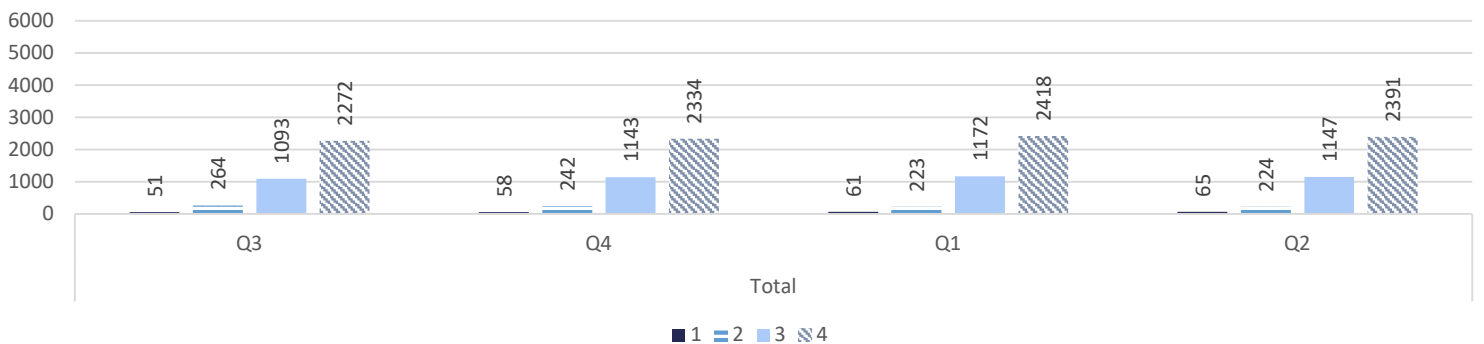
Mental Health Level of Care Region 1 - By Average Population

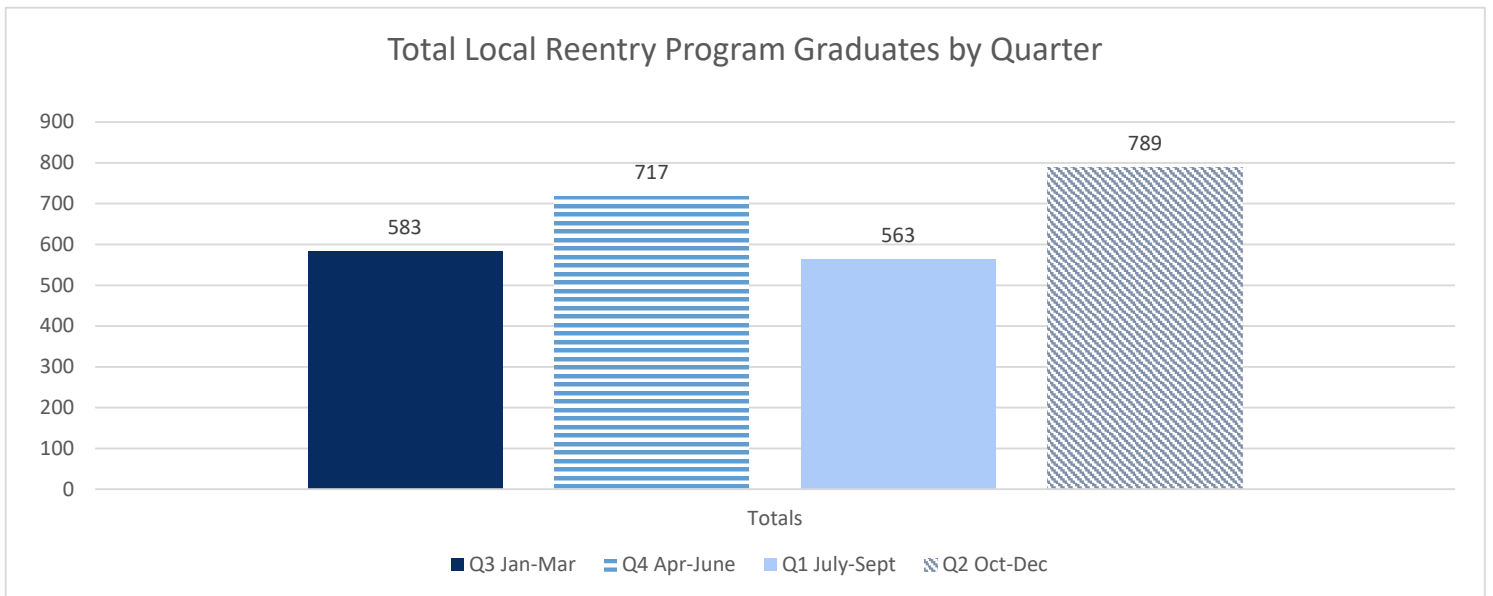
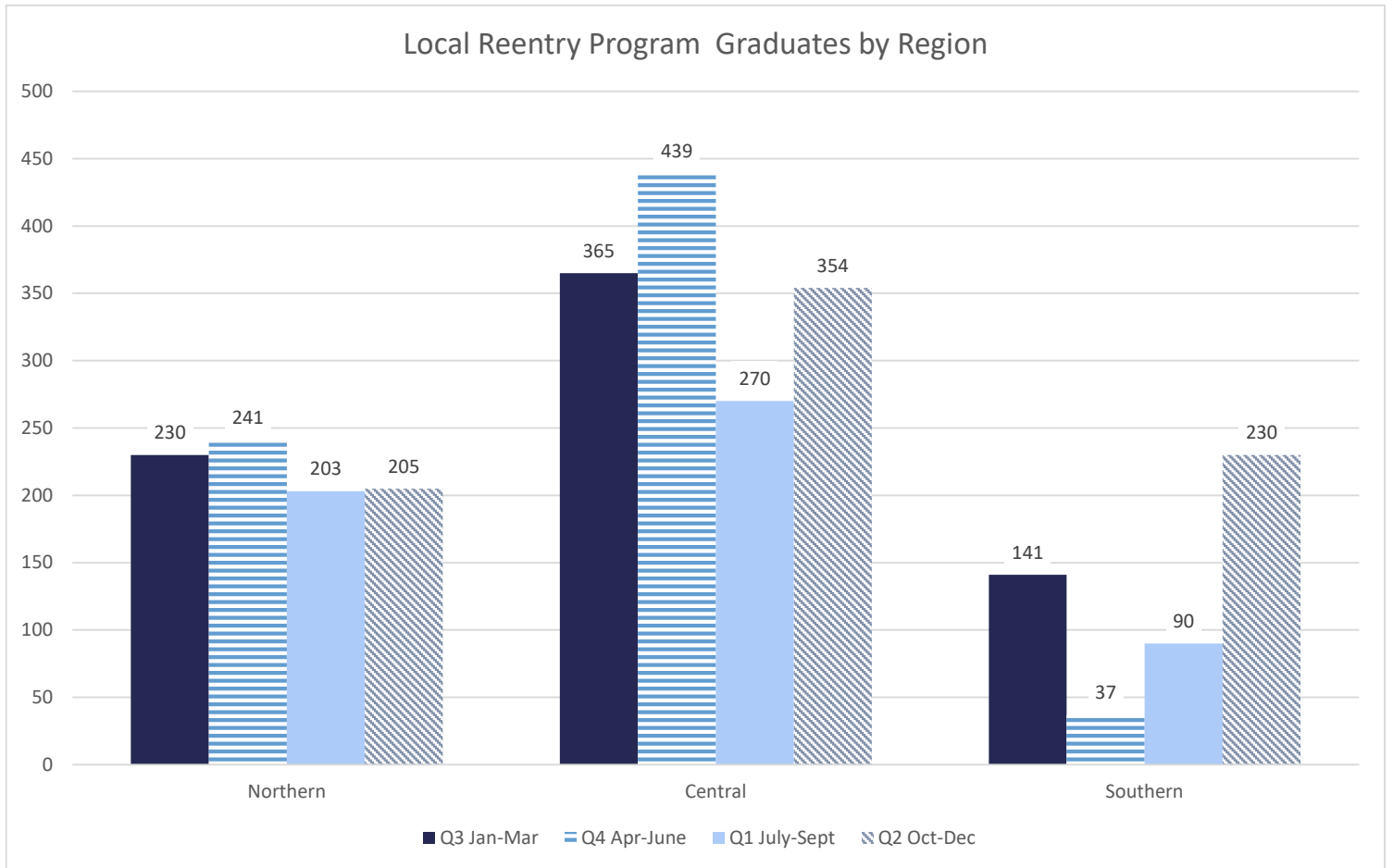


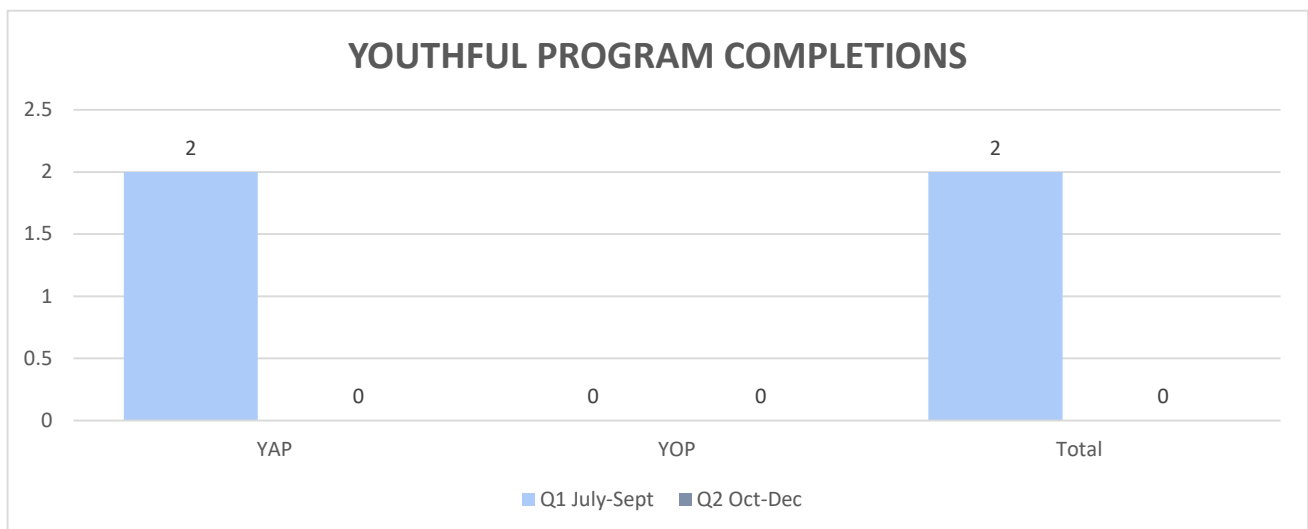
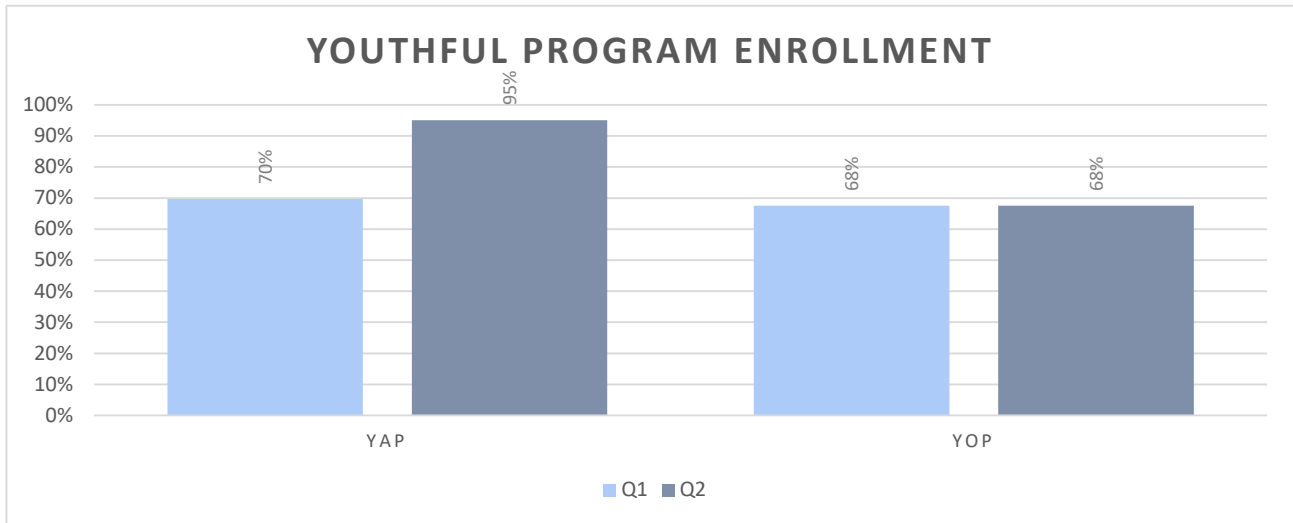
Total Individuals Who Refused Programming by Quarter

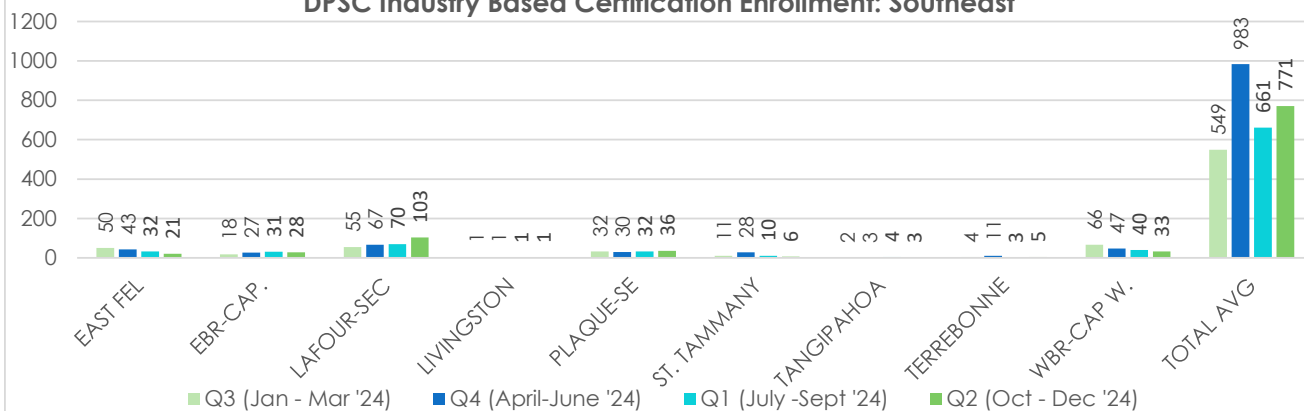
DPSC Industry Based Certification Enrollment: North



DPSC Industry Based Certification Enrollment: Central/Southwest



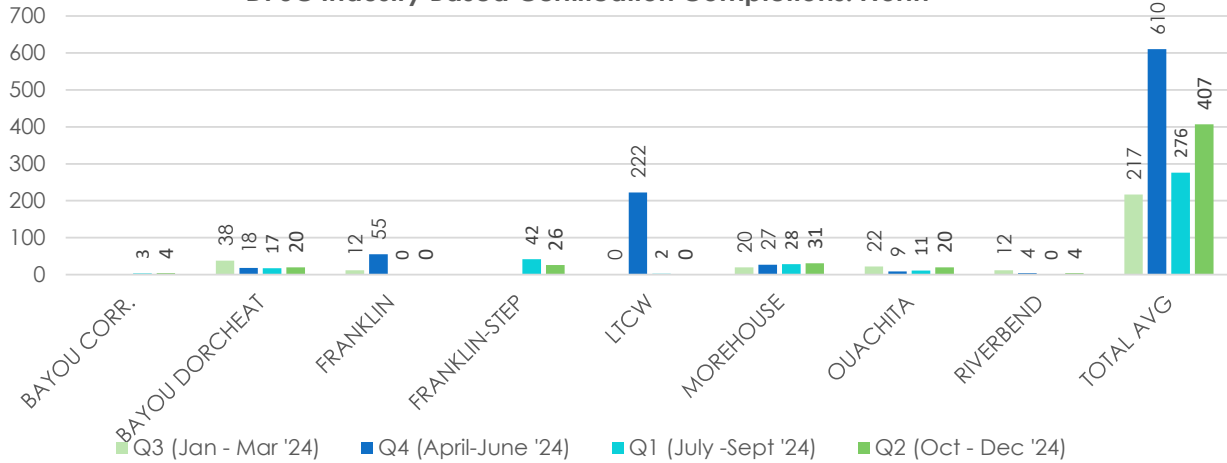

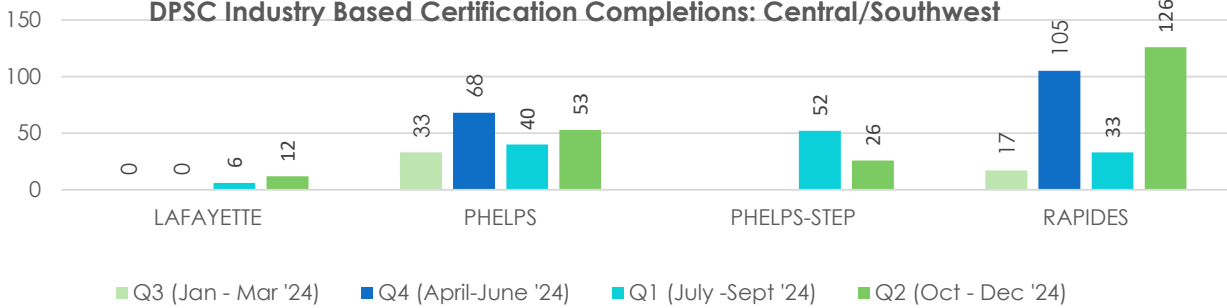

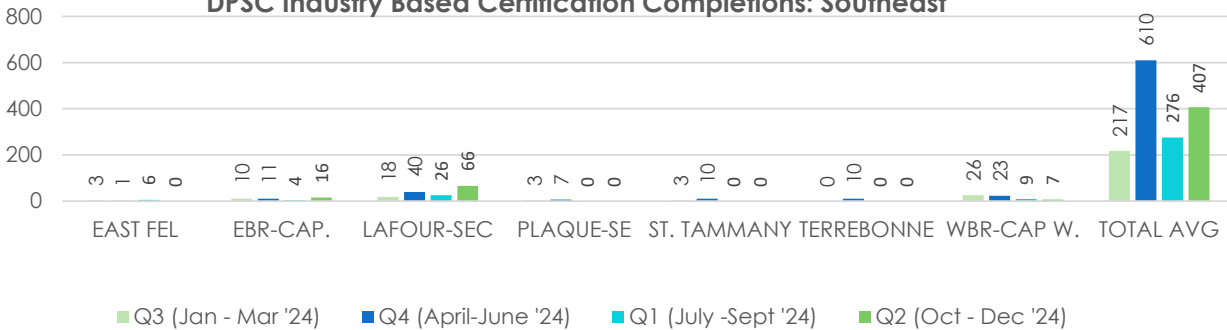
DPSC Industry Based Certification Completions: North



DPSC Industry Based Certification Completions: Central/Southwest



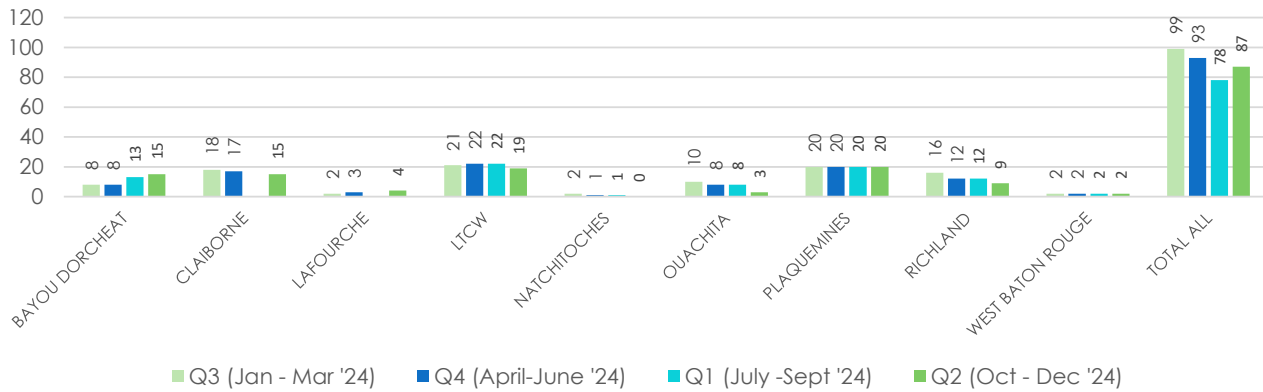

Dialogue- A structured, victim initiated process guided by trained facilitators and directed toward enabling a crime

Facilitators are volunteers

Cases includes both assigned and unassigned cases and represents last day of quarter.

Closed-Cases have been closed at recommendation of facilitator, advisory board or per request of offender/victim

Completed- the number of cases in which a dialogue occurred.

Visits- Facilitators visit at the institution with the offender.

Each case is assigned two facilitators. Some facilitators may be assigned

to multiple victim/survivor to talk safely and directly with the offender who committed the crime.

Total of cases are average for the quarter
