The submission of a Victim Impact and Reentry Statement is a voluntary right for people harmed by crime. The purpose is to help the Committee on Parole understand how a crime has affected you and what special parole conditions you may want to request should the inmate is released.

Statements must be received at least 14 days prior to the scheduled parole hearing.

Mark CONFIDENTIAL if you do not want the statement(s) shared with the inmate and their attorney. Confidential statements will only be shared with the Committee on Parole and cannot be read into the official record during the parole hearing.

- 1. 1. Please ensure you include the inmate's name, DOC #, and hearing date. It is also important that you include your contact information.
- 2. 2. It is essential that the statement is received at least 14 days before the scheduled parole hearing.
- 3. Please also provide a copy of your statement to the Victim Assistance Coordinator for inclusion in the pre-parole investigation.

Victims should be aware that inmates cannot contact them before any scheduled hearing.
